Discrimination is Banned

O1 No one should treat persons with disabilities unfairly.



O2 Anyone who faces lasting difficulty in doing normal daily activities because of a condition or impairment is considered a person with disability.



- O3 If an organization discriminates, they pay a fine of \\$1,000,000.
- O4 Persons with disabilities have the right to complain and seek justice.
- O5 If a person discrimates, they pay #100,000 or face 6 months in prison.





Ease of Movement and Access to Buildings

O1 All public spaces must allow free entry and movement for persons with disabilities.



A COFFEE FOR

ACCESS FOR ALL Buildings must have ramps, lifts, and other aids.

- O3 Government gave 5 years for old buildings to fix access isssues.
- O4 Any new building without disability access will not be approved.
- O5 Car parks must have reserved spaces for persons with disabilities.





Road Transportation

O1 Buses, cars, and stops must have ramps, lifts, and aids for wheelchairs.



O2 Public vehicles must have audio and visual announcement s.

O3 Special parking must be kept for persons with disabilities.



O4 Drivers must stop fully before persons with disabilities enter or exit.





Seaports, Railways, and Airports

O1 Seaports and trains must be accessible within 5 years.

O2 Airplanes must provide wheelchairs, safe boarding, and special assistance.

O3 Persons with disabilities board first and leave last.





O4 Airports must provide information in formats, persons with disabilities can understand.





Freedom, Education, Health, and Priority Rights

- O1 Persons with disabilities must not be forced to beg.
- O2 Free education up to secondary school is guaranteed.
- 03 Schools must have special teachers, Braille, and sign language.

O4 Persons with disabilities have the right to healthcare and must not be treated differently.



05 They must be **prioritized** in emergencies and queues.









Employment and Participation in Public Life

O1 Persons with disabilities have the right to work and be paid equally.

O3 They must be allowed to join politics, public life, and NGOs.



O4 Employers who deny them work will pay fines up to \$\\\\\\\\$500.000.





Creation of the National Commission for Persons with Disabilities

O1 The Act
creates the
National
Commission
for Persons
with
Disabilities.

03 It will ensure buildings, schools, and services are inclusive.



O2 The Commission will protect rights, receive complaints, and support persons with disabilities.

O4 It will provide assistive devices, scholarships and awareness campaigns.





Executive Secretary and Staff of the Commission

O1 The head of the Commission must be a person with disability.



O2 The commission will employ staff and report to the Government.

03 It will publish annual reports and accounts for transparency.

VALIDATION NOTE

This Simplified Version of the Kogi State Discrimination Against Persons With Disabilities (Prohibition) Law, 2019

After careful review and collation of inputs, participants confirmed that this simplified version accurately reflects the key provisions, intent and spirit of the original law as passed by the Kogi State House of Assembly. It was also affirmed that the document is suitable for public use, sensitization and community awareness to promote protection of women, children and persons with disabilities across Kogi State, Nigeria.

This validated version therefore serves as an official, user-friendly booklet to enhance understanding and enforcement of the law.


